



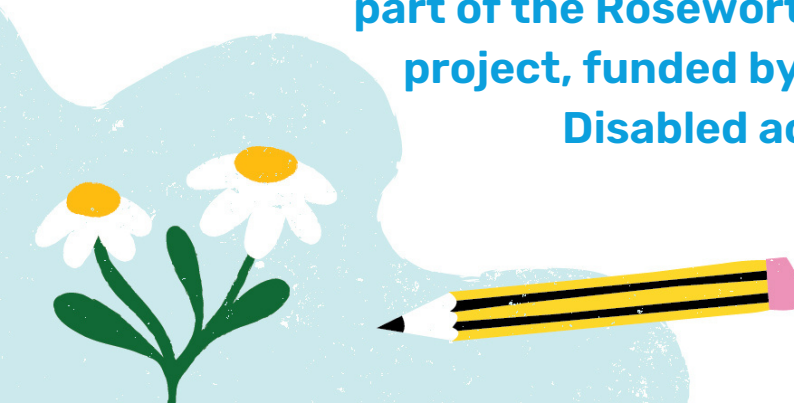

Happy herbal bathing

Herbs of the garden and hedgerow have been used for thousands of years to naturally enhance health and beauty. During this practical session we will be making herbal milk baths, herbal body salt scrubs and bath bombs. Come away with other low-cost recipes to create at home.
